The Florida university and community college library systems have a centralized organization for technology services, the online catalog, and electronic resources licensing - the Florida Virtual Campus (FLVC). The Florida Academic Library Services (FALSC) is a branch of FLVC. I supported the digital library section in this organization, and worked to support the statewide Islandora platform, currently powering digital libraries for 13 campuses with 11 more digital libraries in development for future launch, and Florida Online Journals, a platform implemented in Open Journal Systems (OJS) software and currently hosting 23 journals. In support of the digital library platform, I worked with a team to maintain documentation, including a FALSC support wiki geared toward libraries in Florida, contributing to the open source community through documentation and maintaining portions of a training manual for the Islandora software, and I frequently met with incoming librarians and archivists around the state to onboard and introduced to technologies supported by FALSC. In my time at FLVC/FALSC, I became comfortable in backend technologies which underlie the web HTML and desktop software, including significant time in a Unix environment, and passing familiarity with SQL and shell scripting. I also became familiar with XSLT and XML manipulation, and was the primary maintainer of metadata XML forms used in the Islandora platform, including XSLT and XPATH to interact with records. Routinely coordinated and led technical work in migrations between digital library hosting platforms. Led the statewide migration from Archon to ArchivesSpace during winter of 2018/19. Until summer 2019, FLVC operated the Florida Digital Archive, a digital preservation system used by all state universities in Florida except for Florida Polytechnic. I was briefly a backup contact for the Florida Digital Archive, and attended meetings and discussions related to assessing possible replacement software. Through this I have recent familiarity with digital preservation. Coordinated content and technical aspects of implementing the Florida Open Academic Library, Florida's centralized search of digital library materials from around the state. I inventoried what open access materials were made available through Florida public higher education and worked with computer programmers regarding how to harvest records through OAI-PMH and present records centrally in a federated search. 40 hrs/wk

Digital Libraries

Knowledge of and course work in a wide variety of metadata standards, including Dublin Core, MODS, METS, RDA, EAD, and MARC. Knowledge of and coursework in controlled vocabularies and authority control, including Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH).

Extensive experience with MODS. While at FLVC, I was the primary maintainer of forms for editing MODS records in the Islandora platform used by 13 university and college libraries in Florida for digital library hosting. While at FLVC, I was routinely responsible for metadata quality control on MODS records, and for examining software that crosswalks between MARC and MODS or vice versa.

Experience with METS. At FLVC, I worked with troubleshooting issues that might occur in crosswalking the METS structmap to JSON. I also worked with analyzing METS records for descriptive metadata and repurposing descriptive metadata from the dmdsect portion of the METS record.

Experience with EAD records. I was the primary contact at FLVC for the statewide migration from Archon to ArchivesSpace. In this role, I reviewed data quality issues reported by archivists around the state. When a data quality issue was noted by any institution, I assessed all institutions for that issue and as appropriate put out centralized guidance and documentation to assist in getting records smoothly and accurately transitioned.

Experience with Islandora and Digital Commons. Knowledge of other platforms including DSpace, and ContentDM.

Significant experience with Omeka: developing themes, debugging plugins, configuration, and system administration.

Good background knowledge in document preparation using Adobe Acrobat Professional including optical character recognition, redaction, and batch processing. At FLVC, I tended to do preliminary analysis of "problem" PDFs which load irregularly onto any platform (ie. Thumbnails aren't generated, MIME type detected incorrectly), determine whether the problem is in the PDF or the software platform, and appropriately work with the library to adjust workflows or with programmers at FLVC to fix any software issue.

SIGNIFICANT COMMITTEE WORK

- In 2018, I served with the Sunshine State Digital Network (SSDN) Metadata Working Group. The committee also kept print and microfilm standards in place, so that libraries can easily look up standards relevant to print acquisitions.
